### 2018-2019 Tuition Rates

Despite the increase in the Oakland Diocesan salary scale (long waited for and well deserved for our teachers!) and the increase in benefits, we have been able to hold the tuition increase below 5%. Thank you to our Finance Committee for their very fine stewardship of OLG's finances! Registration for the 2018-19 school year is due between May 1-15, 2018. There is no increase in the enrollment fee for the new school year. Details are published on the next page.
